



Lifeline Federal Assistance Program

Lifeline is a federal program that lowers the monthly cost of phone and internet service for qualifying households. Eligible consumers will get up to \$9.25 toward their bill. You can only use Lifeline for either phone or internet service, but not both. To learn more about Lifeline or apply for a Lifeline discount, visit lifelinesupport.org.

How to Qualify for a Lifeline Program Discount

You must participate in at least one of the following programs to be eligible for a Lifeline Program discount:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Medicaid
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Tribal Programs (and live on federally recognized Tribal lands)

Visit checklifeline.org/lifeline to see if you qualify.

**Some restrictions and conditions apply. Does not include taxes and surcharges. Only eligible consumers may enroll in Lifeline. Documentation is necessary for enrollment. The Lifeline benefit expires after 12 months. To renew a Lifeline benefit, the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) will send you a notice to recertify. View their website for more information: checklifeline.org/lifeline. Lifeline discount is only applicable if BARC Connects service is available at the address.
